FLY TYING 2015 CURRICULUM / SCHEDULE

Fly Tying will take place at the Rockville Izaak Walton League's Clubhouse, 18301 Waring Station Road, in Germantown on Tuesday evenings, 7:30 – 9:00 pm. Participation is free. Tools (vice, bobbins, scissors, etc) will be provided if students do not have their own. Materials (hooks, thread, dubbing, chenille, feathers etc.) will also be provided.

BEGINNERS CLASS

Session 1: **January 13**: Introduction to fly tying—hook anatomy, specialized vocabulary, the tools, and tying a thread base. Microchenille will be used to tye the Green Weenie and the San Juan Worm.

Session 2: **January 20**: Woolly Buggers in a variety of color combinations will be tied to teach the use of marabou feathers for tails, and the technique of "palmering" hackle feathers. The famous "IWL wooly bugger" will also be shown.

JANUARY 27. NO CLASS. CHAPTER MEETING **Session 3**: **February 3**: Walt's Worm and the Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear nymph will be tied to introduce students to dubbing, ribbing, and the formation of a wing case.

Session 4: **February 10**: Pheasant tail feathers, and peacock hurl will be used to tie the Pheasant Tail Nymph. Introduction to dry flies—the Elk Hair Caddis, which involves dubbing and "palmering" hackle, then using coastal deer hair to form the wing.

Session 5: February 17: Last session for beginners. Dry Flies continued: the Adams, which will involve using grizzly and brown hackle feathers to form the tail, wings, and hackle of the fly and grey dubbing to form the body. To prepare for these sessions, go onto the Internet, then Google "YouTube Fly Tying Instructions" followed by the name of the fly you want to tie, e.g. pheasant tail nymph or the Adams dry fly. There is likely to be a number of links you may choose from. Follow any one that seems interesting. Some of the videos are excellent, especially those featuring Tim Flagler.

2014 RECAP

SVTU held meetings in January, March, April, May and November with stream-side meetings in September (join with Project Healing Waters) and October (hosting a learn to fly fish half day training).

If you missed the meetings, you missed learning about the insect life cycles that trout depend on how we mimic with the flies we use, local places to fish (tidal Potomac, and Frederick and Washington County streams), conservation efforts in the Upper Potomac Basin, and a hands-on with the latest fly-fishing gear. Don't miss the next informative and education set of meetings by joining us both stream-side and at our indoor meetings.

The Chapter hosted our first fly-fishing 101 course, a half-day learn to fly fish course. The course included: fly casting; steam and lake fishing techniques; knots; rigging; entomology; and fly types. The course was organized by SVTU and included certified Casting Instructors, a leading macro invertebrate entomologist, and the knowledge of SVTU members. The course was well received and well attended.

In addition to the regular meetings, SVTU sponsored, or participated in several events in 2014.

- Sponsored, with the Izaak Walton League's Rockville Chapter, FREE fly tying lessons that covered tools, materials and techniques and moved participants from the simplest first fly to spun deer hair flies.
- Sponsored the annual Chapter BBQ at Seneca Creek State Park and a fund-raiser at Gaithersburg's Dogfish Head Ale House.

- Partnered with the Isaak Walton League's Rockville Chapter to sample the stream's benthic macro invertebrates in Great Seneca Creek.
- Participated in the National Capital Fly Fishing Show, and Little Bennett Park's Great Outdoors Festival to inform others about the conservation message of Trout Unlimited and the activities of SVTU.
- SVTU hosted stream workdays at Beaver Creek to complete maintenance of the areas we helped restore.
