CHARLES S. AUGUST MEMORIAL FLY TYING SESSIONS

WHEN: STARTED TUESDAY, JAN. 17th WHERE: IWLA Chapter House, 18301 Waring Station Road; Germantown TIME: 7:30 – 9:30 p.m. WHAT: Fly Tying with Chapter Members

We dedicate our annual fly tying sessions to the memory of Charles, a long time board member of our chapter who started and led our past fly tying courses. SVTU is handling the fly tying evenings different this year. Rather than have a structured class with a formal syllabus, we are going to create a fly tying environment for anyone at any skill level. There will be instructors available so assistance is at hand if you need help, but there will not be a formal "class." It will be up to those interested in fly tying to bring ideas, questions, and patterns with them to the class.

THE CURRENT SCHEDULE IS: January 17th & 31st February 7th & 21st March 7th & 21st April 4th: Try out your flies!

SVTU has a limited collection of fly tying materials that will be available for your use. We also have basic tool sets that you can borrow.

No need to spend a ton of money in tools or materials just to try a fly pattern. Come by and work with experienced tyers to figure it out and decide if you like it. And even if you do not have a pattern to tie, come by have a beer and see what everyone else is tying and enjoy some time out of the house this winter. The first fly that will be featured is the Serendipity, a Caddis emerger pattern. Materials needed for this fly will be available.

RECENT 2016 SVTU ACTIVITIES

RECAP OF CHAPTER MEETINGS

• SEPTEMBER:

OCTOBER:

Presenter::Greg Cwalina of Patuxent River Flies

Program: Building a bamboo fly rod Greg gave a wonderful presentation on the steps it took to build a bamboo fly rod from a stalk of bamboo. It takes time and a lot of patience.

NOVEMBER:

Presenter: Ken Mack, Aquatic Biologist, of Montgomery County

Program: Streams of Montgomery County Ken gave an outstanding presentation on the streams in Montgomery county. He talked about the health of the streams, and what the county is doing to help mitigate stream impacts from development. He even talked about where there "might" be some trout. Yes, there are trout in Montgomery county!

CONSERVATION PROGRAMS:

• BEAVER CREEK STREAM MAINTENANCE

It is not enough to plant riparian buffer areas and then walk away, they take maintenance too. On Saturday, **November 26, 2016,** SVTU volunteers gathered along Beaver Creek to spend the morning on maintaining the plantings in the stream restoration areas that SVTU helped install. The five volunteers hacked at invasives, pruned branches, removed tree guards, installed tree guards, widened trails, and generally cleaned up the area. We found little actual trash thanks to the conservation ethos of fly fisherman, but there was a lot of vegetative "trash" to clear. It was a good time on a beautiful day and only one volunteer found the nearby electric fence.

TROUT IN THE CLASSROOM

On **December 16th** several members of the Chapter supported the Trout In the Classroom (TIC) egg distribution of eggs to schools in the Chapter area.

FLY FISHING 101

SVTU will again partner with the Rockville Chapter of Isaak Walton League to offer our fourth third "Learn to Fly Fish" afternoon (or as we call it Fly Fishing 101) at the Rockville Chapter Lake. It will be a day of pure enjoyment for all.

Volunteer instructors will guide students

through a series of "classes" that will cover basic elements of fly fishing, such as: casting, rigging, knots, macroinvertebrate entomology, flies, stream fishing techniques, and lake fishing techniques. The instructors are members or friends of Seneca Valley Chapter of Trout Unlimited, augmented with additional FFF casting instructors.

• INVERTEBRATE STUDY

We are planning another study this year, again with the assistance of Steve Moulton of the USGS who has been our expert in aquatic entomology. studies. We have supported this activity for the past few years. The day is a great opportunity for adults and children to participate and learn, about the health of the lake and stream. The day will include collecting, inventorying, and studying the insect life.

Spring is not too far away. It also marks the time DNR commences stocking of the local streams. Check out the DNR Fisheries website for updates soon. Also check out the new regulations for any changes to streams' categorization. This applies to all waters / species.
