FISHING AT HILTON HEAD ISLAND-2011

I was fortunate once again to be able to go on a half-day guide fishing trip while vacationing on Hilton Head Island, SC over the 4th of July week. Unlike the previous two years, however, I wasn't fishing alone. Nate, one of our longtime members and the Chapter Treasurer, went out with me.

We met up with Brian Vaughn of 'Off The Hook Charters' around 11:30 am, under the Cross Island Parkway Bridge,

and we headed out into Caliboque Sound with the intent of trying to locate some redfish to toss our flies at. Brian quickly located a likely looking spot in the tall grass, and we started looking for some tailing reds. We spotted a couple of tailing fish and twice I tried to place my fly in front of them – one a nice redfish and the other a large black drum (Brian said he rarely sees them and was excited about the chance to try to hook one). However, the outgoing tide was stirring up the water just enough to make it difficult to track the fish; to determine just what direction they were headed so we knew where to drop a fly. After about 30 minutes of this futility, Brian suggested we head to another spot, and that we might have to try using bait, so he stopped on the way and tossed his net out several times to fill the bait well with 8-9 inch menhaden. We ended up off the south end of the island, about a halfmile out, where Brian's fishing guide buddies were checking out an area for mackerel. We fished the area for about an hour and had a lot of fish taking half the bait - Brian thought they were probably small bluefish getting a free meal. None of the other boats were having any luck either. Just before we decided to call it guits and move to another location, I hooked up with a dusky shark and then Nate followed with a black-tipped shark. I caught one more dusky shark before we headed back up Calibogue Sound, where Brian took us to an area he had recently checked out and now considers his favorite spot.

He anchored the boat about 15 feet off the grass and indicated to us that there was a drop-off, about 10-20 feet behind the boat. Little did we know that the fun was about to begin! Very soon after the first bait hit the water, we started getting hits. At first, we missed the hit, as we were striking too soon; Brian told us to hold off until the fish started pulling the line out, and then set the hook. That strategy worked, and we soon started to catch fish – all sharks. I got a black-tipped and several bonnet head (also called spade head which are close 'cousins' of hammerhead sharks) and Nate also caught a number of bonnet head sharks.

All of the sharks were in the 3-4 foot range and weighed 15 to 17 pounds. They really put up a nice fight on the medium weight spinning gear that Brian prefers to use. At one point, all three of us had fish on! Here's a photo of Nate and me with two nice bonnet head sharks.



So, if you ever get a chance to fish Hilton Head, check out Off The Hook Charters. Brian is an excellent guide. You

never know what you will hook up with! And, if you go, take a friend, it's much more fun. Stan Oaks

Macro-invertebrate Sampling & Fly Fishing Introduction Day



On Saturday, May 14, SVTU teamed up with IWLA Rockville to assist with macro-invertebrate sampling (adults & youth involved in the Save Our Streams program) and fly fishing instruction. In the morning, volunteers and participants focused on sampling for aquatic life in Seneca Creek near Clopper Rd in Germantown. Samples were collected, sorted, and then identified. Breaking for lunch, participants enjoyed a cookout beside the IWLA Lake.

After lunch, SVTU volunteers mentored aspiring youth & adult anglers by instructing them on the basics of fly casting and fishing. The rookie fly anglers caught on quickly and hauled in several bluegills. One young student managed to hook/land a 10" largemouth bass on an olive bead-head woolly bugger.

TU Stream Clean-ups

This year SVTU participated in both (2) TU National Stream Clean-up events. This is our 2nd consecutive year that our chapter has participated by hosting an event on both the April and June dates.



On April 16,-in the midst of pouring rain, wind, and thunder storms; SVTU had a great "dual clean-up" success, featuring simultaneous events at 2 sites (Little Seneca (Boyds) and Beaver (Hagerstown) Creeks. Here is a quick look at the numbers:

32 Volunteers 36 Bags of trash 8 Wheels & tires

Special thanks to Doug Hutzell for leading the clean-up at Antietam Creek. Also, we were fortunate to partner with the Sigma Alpha Epsilon (SAE) chapter from the University of Maryland for their True Gentleman Day of Service. The SAEs showed up in force with a total of 20 brothers volunteering.

On June 18, a small but mighty crew of 8 volunteers worked to repair damage and remove debris from the numerous high water events at Beaver Creek this spring. The members worked to restake trees previously planted by SVTU and the Beaver Creek Watershed Association, install a new fishing access sign, and remove trash. This event finished off our TU Stream Clean-up Days for the spring. Be on the lookout for the 2012 TU Clean-up dates (likely announced in February).

Fly Fishing / Fishing Supplies and Resources

The local resources for spin or fly-fishing equipment, flytying materials, etc., are dwindling. Sports Authority in Frederick has eliminated their fishing section and the Gaithersburg store is in the process of eliminating theirs. both Gaithersburg and Frederick, has eliminated their entire fishing section. Dick's does not carry fly-fishing items in stock though their fishing section is huge and several members of their staff are excellent sources of advice. Also, the Orvis shop in Bethesda does not carry fly-tying materials, and the Tysons Corner store has a much smaller inventory of materials than in the past.

Good news is we have two local fly-fishing shops that we can count on!
