
Tailwater Trifecta: A Fishing Road Trip to Three Tailwaters Holston, White and San Juan

- It was a grand road-trip, this is our story...


The Road Trip: Leg 1 Hagerstown to Bristol, TN

South Holston Tailwater Provide minimum flow with a 7.5 foot weir dam




South Holston Tailwater At minimum flow the water is low—almost like a series of pools








On a schedule set by TVA, the power generators are turned on and water levels come up several feet


The Road Trip: South Holston Summary

- We fished with guides. It would be a hard river to wade (access and changing water flow)
- There is a stream about 30 miles to the south (Watauga) that is more suited for wading
- We fished with 2 different guides out of the South Holston Fly shop
- Day 1 in the rain, a combination of dry flies and nymphs, we brought 25-30 fish to the boat
- Day 2, nymphed all day, and also netted about 25-30 fish
- More rainbows than browns with sizes up to 12-14 inches
- At fly shop recommendation, we stayed at the Bristol Hotel in town, but lots of rentals along the stream.












We were not impressed. Catching fish this size was not what we thought the White was known for.

The Road Trip: White River Summary

- We fished with guides, it would be impossible to wade this river (access and changing water flow)
- Day 1, from Wildcat Shoals, purple or ruby midge under a caddis soft hackle all day, 30+ fish to the boat, 2 browns <12" and rainbows up to 14" but most 10"
- Day 2, #12 hopper from morning to 2:00 pm brought in 4 big browns and 20 or so rainbows 12-16"
- Shifted to purple beadhead nymph under a beadhead caddis pupa and boated 40 rainbow in 2 hours most 12"
- We stayed at the Cedarwood Lodge
- There are several lodges, some rentals along the stream, but very limited restaurants near Flippin




Note that Flippin AR is about half way from Hagerstown to the San Juan NM


San Juan River Basin








The Road Trip: San Juan Summary

- We fished mainly on our own with guides a day or two. Most of the San Juan is accessible (State Park).
- Every person caught fish every day they fished.
- More rainbows than browns, up to about 20 inches
- Some BWO drys but mostly BWO emergers, and nymphs in the afternoons.
- The San Juan is a midge river, larva (#18 and 20), pupa (#24 and 26) and emergers (#22, 24 and 26).
- We stayed at the Octagon Inn, lodging is limited as are restaurants.








The Road Trip: Rio Grande Summary

- We fished with a wade guide one day and on our own a day
- Access at Pilar is easy, limited access in the canyon
- Catching was tough on our trip! Need to hit the Rio Grande at the right time to catch many fish
- We stayed in Taos, plenty of motels and restaurants
- Taos is a tourist destination and is priced accordingly



Details

- Tailwater focus so flow on all streams is managed
 - South Holston in Tennessee
 - TVA dam flow changes are announced
 - Flow is managed for lake levels both on the SoHo and downstream. Power is secondary.
 - Min flows provided by a secondary structure (Weir dam)
 - White in Arkansas
 - USACE dam flows for power production are not announced
 - Flow is managed for both lake level and power production.
 - Min flows provided by continuous operation of one power turbine
 - San Juan in New Mexico
 - Bureau of Reclamation dam flow changes are announced
 - Flow is managed for downstream irrigation and environmental needs. Power is secondary.
 - Min flows provided by constant release

Details

Trip

- On the Road 22 days total
- Fished for 12 days on three different tailwaters plus the Rio Grande
 - South Holston in Tennessee
 - White in Arkansas
 - San Juan in New Mexico
- Drove almost 5,000 miles
- Cost
 - Fuel/truck \$800 roundtrip
 - Lodging \$60-\$80 per person per night
 - Food \$10-\$25 per person per day
 - Guides \$250 per person per day plus tip

Details

• Fishing

- Caught Fish on every river we fished!
- South Holston in Tennessee
 - Saw a few larger fish. We caught fish up to 12-14 inches.
- White in Arkansas
 - Caught 19-21 inch browns on hoppers. Up to 16 inch rainbow on hoppers
 - Nymphing up to 14 inch rainbows few browns.
- San Juan and Rio Grande Rivers in New Mexico
 - San Juan up to 20 inch browns and rainbow, many 16-18 inches.
 - Rio Grande a few 10-12 inches
- Flies
 - The common tailwater theme is midges #20 #26.
 - Some BWO patterns on the SoHo and San Juan
 - Some Caddis patterns on the White
